Tracking Student Response Rates during an Open Review Period.

Faculty members and their chairs/directors can track student response rates during a current review period (or the most recent review period if no reviews are currently occurring); see page 2 of the training manual for instructions. http://digitalmeasures.kennesaw.edu/course-response/track-responses.php

The average response rates during past administrations has been about 35-40%, which is typical for online ratings systems. The variability among classes ranges from 0% to 100%. Summary reports from past administrations are available at http://digitalmeasures.kennesaw.edu/course-response/reports.php

Suggestions for increasing response rates appear on page 3 of the training manual (link above). Please note: **KSU faculty should not offer any rewards/incentives to students for high response rates**.
